If I can spell... USING IT IN YOUR CLASSROOM

★ Whole Class or Small Group Instruction

In the beginning, I suggest using these worksheets during whole class or small group instruction to teach students how to complete them. I think it's especially important to discuss word meanings together to make sure students understand the correct meaning of each new word.


★ Literacy Center

As students become familiar with the worksheet, you might have them complete them independently or with a partner. These worksheets are an ideal literacy center activity. Answer keys are included so that you or your students may check their work.

★ Write and Wipe Activity

Glue a worksheet to each side of a piece of construction paper and laminate it so you can use the front and back.

Have students use a dry erase marker to complete the activity. Instead of cutting out the letters at the bottom of the page, students simply circle the letters they use and mark out the letters they don't use. They finish the rest of the worksheet the same way.

BENEFITS OF WORD FAMILY PRACTICE

★ Develop Spelling and Phonics Skills

Students learn to use words they know to help them figure out words they don't know that are spelled or sound similarly.

★ Expand Vocabulary

Word family words are easy for students to decode, yet students might not know their meanings. For example, if students know how to spell "cab", then they can easily spell "gab". But, do they know what "gab" means? Use these worksheets to introduce and discuss new vocabulary words and their meanings.

★ Learn Multiple Meanings of Words

Many words included in these worksheets have multiple meanings. Knowing the many meanings of each word increases students' vocabulary and helps them use the word correctly. For example, a "cap" is type of hat, but "cap" also means the lid of a bottle. If your students are illustrating the words, it may be helpful to discuss the different meanings so they know which one to draw.



If I can spell... QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Q: My students have a hard time thinking of illustrations. What should I do?

A: You might ask questions to help them brainstorm ideas like

- What has...?
- What is something that is/has/can...?
- Where would you find a/an...?

or just have them make or build the words they're having trouble with.

Q: How can I modify the worksheets for students' success?

A: Here are several ideas for modification:

- Use the letters at the bottom like a word bank and just write the correct one in front of the stem to eliminate cutting and gluing.
- Complete with a partner or within a small group.
- Omit either the writing or make/draw column.
- Reduce the number of words for students to complete in any column.
- Have students write sentences with each word on the back of the sheet.

Q: I don't see a word family that I need. Will you add it?

A: Maybe! © I've spent hours combing through word families to decide which ones to include. My main criterion was that the word family have at least six words: one focus word and five more words to make from it. If you have a word family that meets that criterion, feel free reach out to me through the contact information below.
