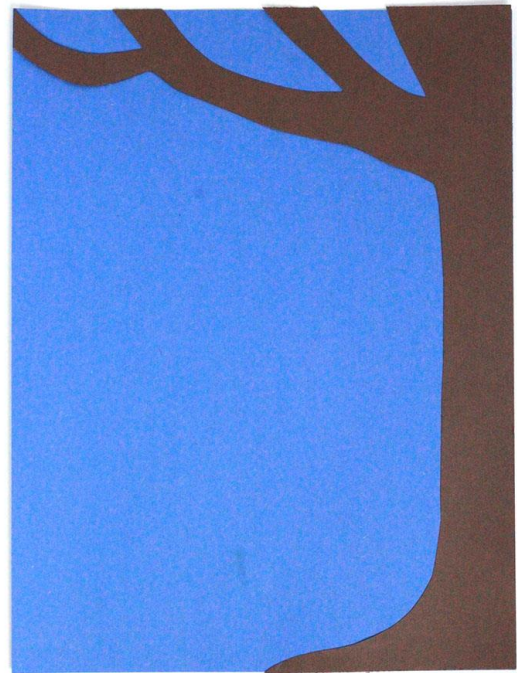
# Fall Leaves Writing Craft

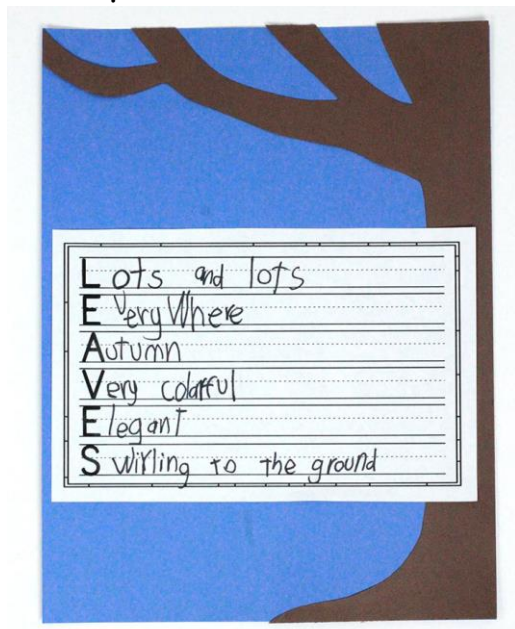
My favorite thing about fall is...

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- 1 Complete one of the writing templates.



- 3 Glue the writing template on the center of the blue paper overlapping the tree.

- 2 Print the tree template on brown paper. Cut it out and glue it to a piece of blue paper.

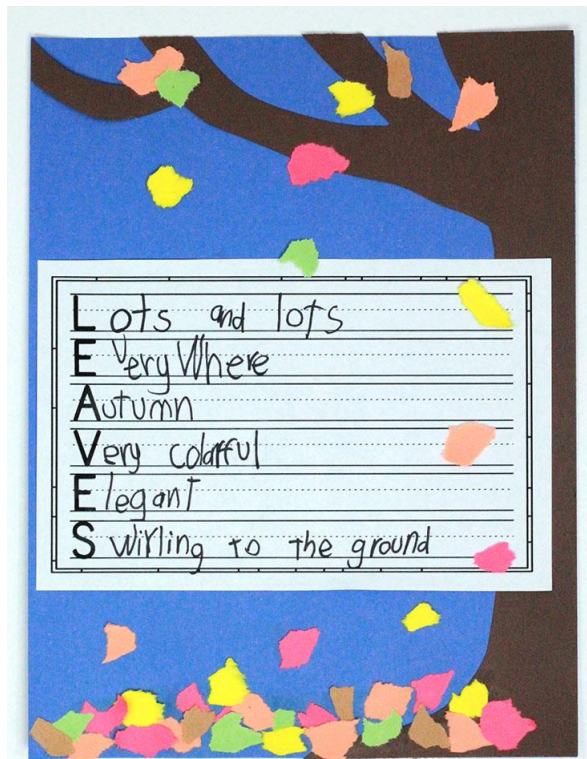


- 4 Tear orange, red, light brown and green paper into small pieces to make leaves.



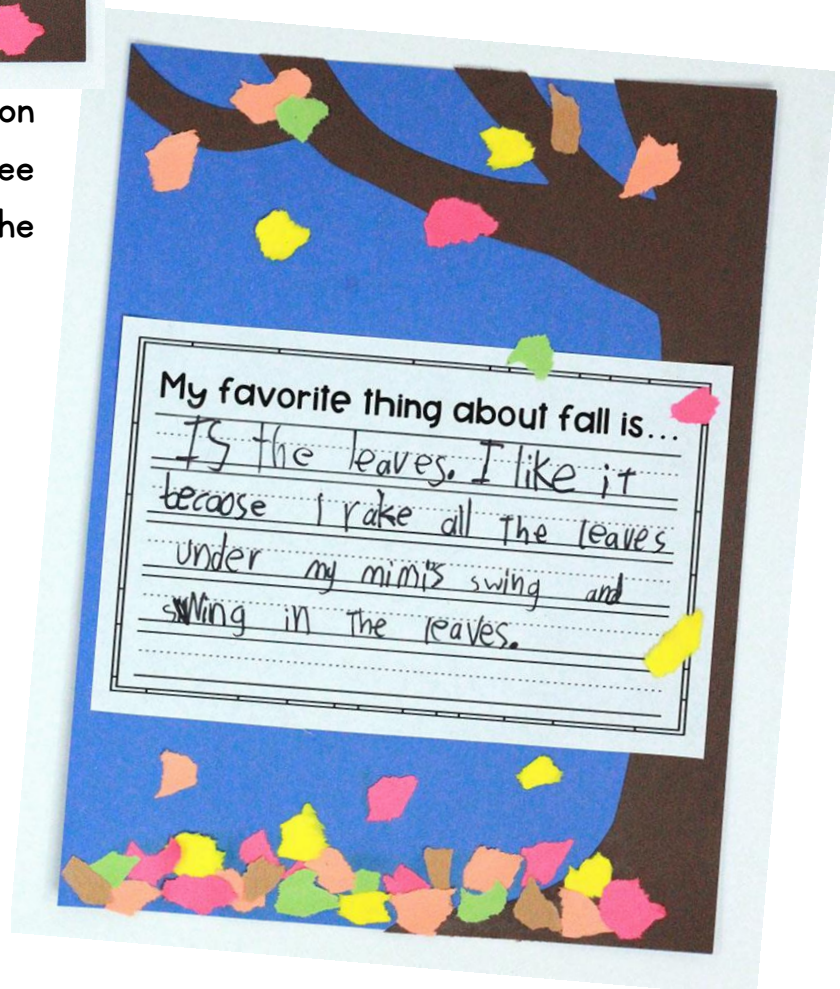

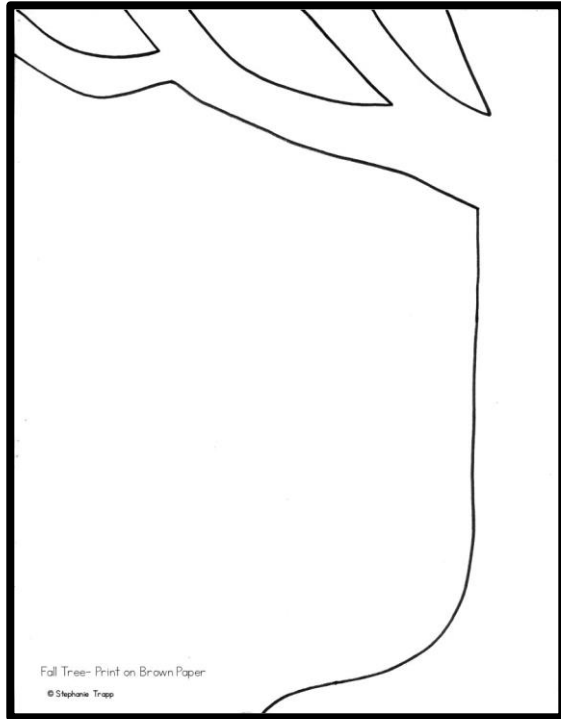

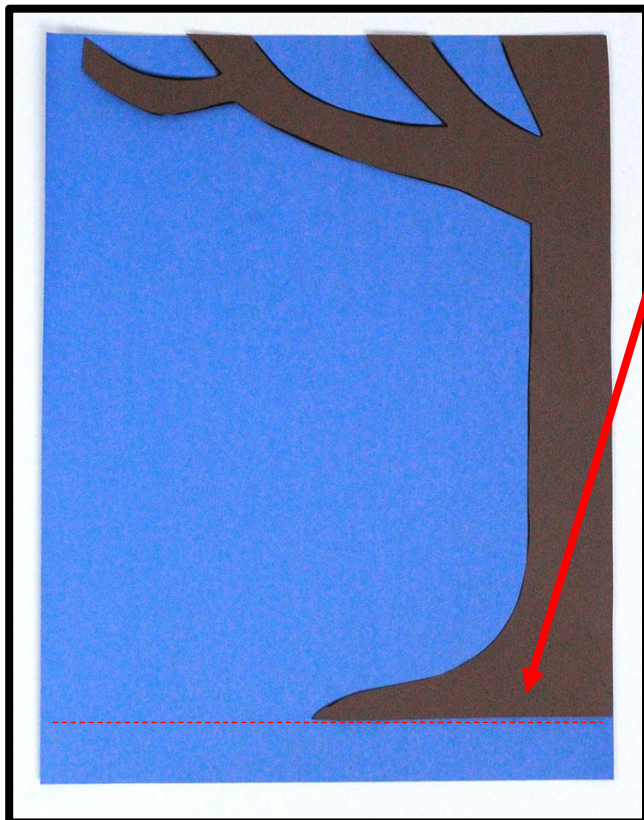
Glue some of the leaves on the ground, some on the tree and a few falling through the air.



# Fall Tree Template Printing Tips



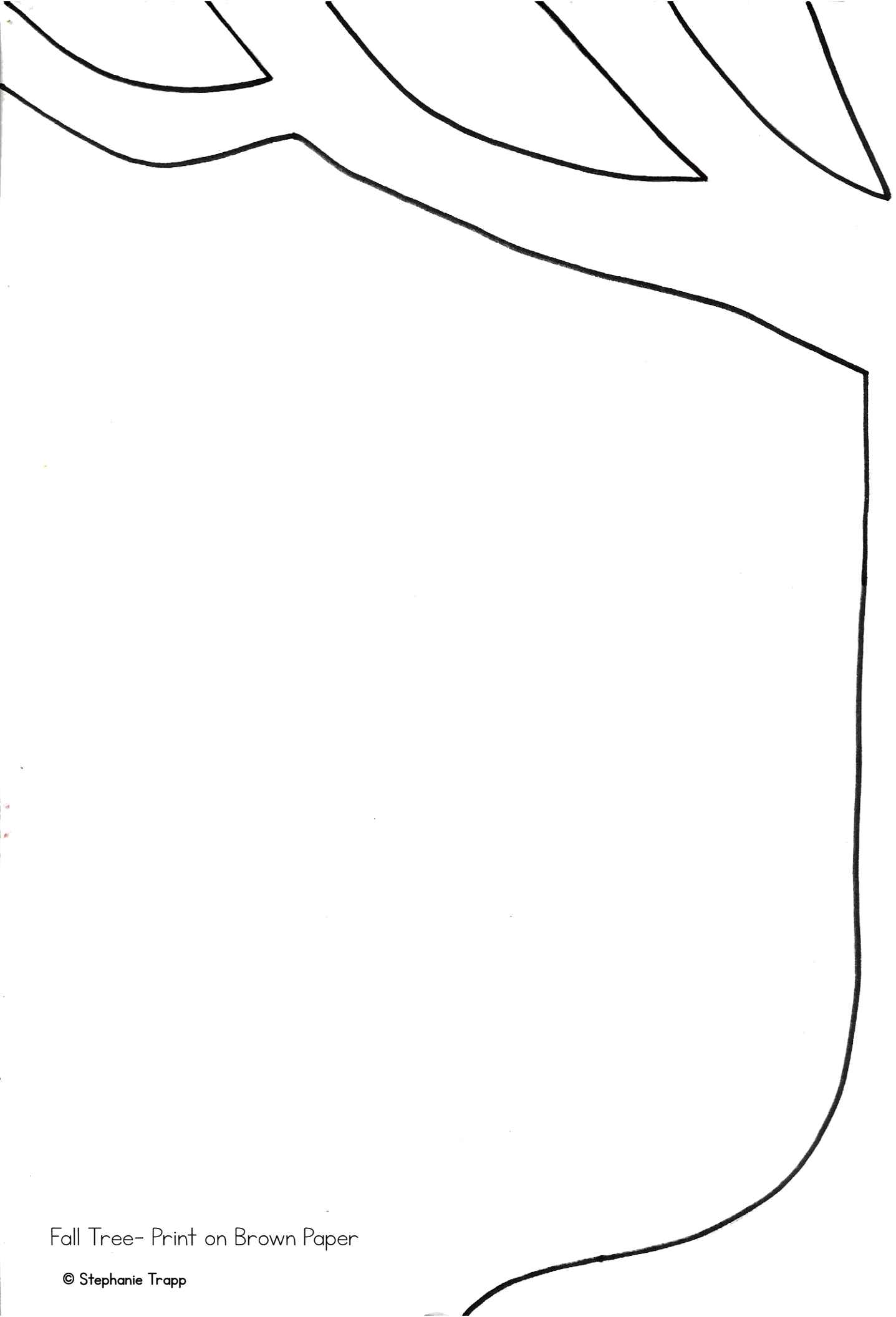
Make sure “Scale to fit paper” is not selected when printing. This will make the tree as large as possible. If you’re able to print without any margin at all (right up to the paper’s edges), that’s even better.



Printer paper is 8.5 in x 11 in, while construction paper is 9 in x 12 in. The tree template (printed on printer paper) will not reach the edges of the construction paper.

Here are two options:

1. Cut off the gap at the bottom of the paper so the tree is at the edge.
2. Have students cover all of the extra space with leaves to fill it in.
