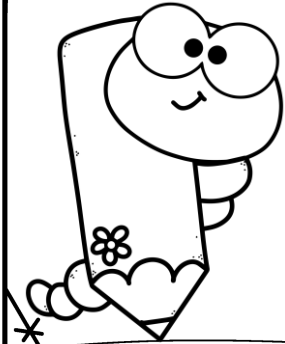

Declarative Sentence

Use the words to make a declarative sentence.

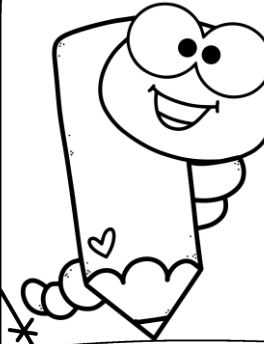


A declarative sentence gives information or facts. It ends with a period.

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Interrogative Sentence

Use the words to make an interrogative sentence.



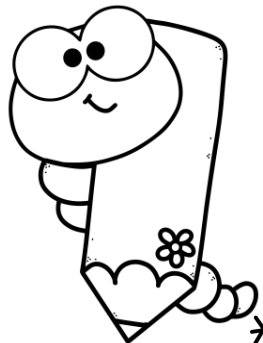
An interrogative sentence asks a question. It ends with a question mark.

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Exclamatory Sentence

Use the words to make an exclamatory sentence.

An exclamatory sentence shows strong feeling or emotion. It ends with an exclamation mark.

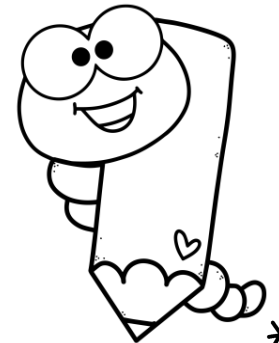


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Imperative Sentence

Use the words to make an imperative sentence.

An imperative sentence gives a command or request. It usually ends with a period.

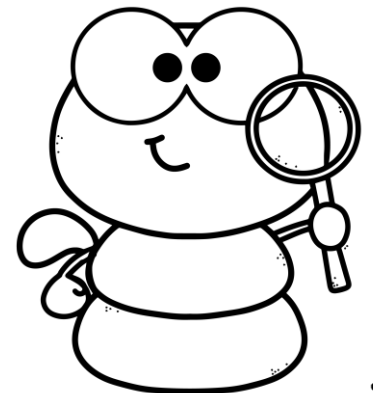

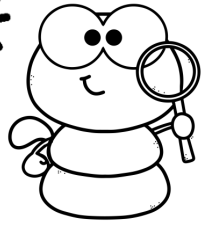


