Polphin Number Line

Materials:


- blue and gray cardstock
- printable number line template (0-10 or 0-20)
- dolphin templates
- popsicle stick
- clear tape
- stick glue
- scissors


Directions:


- I. Print the number line on blue cardstock. Cut along the waves at the top. Cut along the dotted line above the number line making sure not to cut all the way to the edges.
- 2. Print two dolphins on gray cardstock and cut them out. (Optional: print on white cardstock and color them gray.) Tape the end of a popsicle stick to the back of one dolphin. Glue the other dolphin on top of this dolphin so there's a dolphin on both sides of the popsicle stick.
- 3. Insert the popsicle stick in the opening above the number line. To add, move the dolphin along the number line to the right. To subtract, flip the popsicle stick over and move the dolphin along the number line to the left.

 Students use the stick as the quide for counting on the


number line.











